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Packers fans top Steelers fans in PPG ‘Souper’ Bowl Challenge

Milwaukee Christian Center and Greater Pittsburgh Community Food Bank win

PITTSBURGH, Feb. 8, 2011 – An Oak Creek, Wis., plant operated by PPG Industries’ (NYSE:PPG) industrial coatings business announced today that it had won the PPG “Souper” Bowl Challenge against a PPG facility in Springdale, Pa., that encompasses both an industrial coatings plant and a research and development center.
